

We spoke about **Questions that God asks**, in line with a book written by Israel Wayne, and the thought around this is that God asks questions to us, not for His own interest or His own benefit or because He is ignorant, but for our benefit, for our interest and to see if we can be honest enough with ourselves regarding our relationship with God.

The first question we discussed was “Where are you?”

I mentioned earlier that God does not ask this question to find out where you are because God knows. It is possible though that you do not know where you are.

God is everywhere, He is OMNIPRESENT, He knows everything, He is OMNISCIENT.

The Psalmist writes in Psalm 139:7-10

⁷Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?

⁸If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.

⁹If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea,

¹⁰even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.”

The Psalmist accentuates the fact that God is everywhere and that there is no place that we are able to hide from Him

So when God calls you and ask “Where are you?” you can take these four steps

- Answer “Lord here I am”
- Use this time to do introspection.
- Evaluate your circumstances
- Ask God for wisdom to find the right way again

The second question i want to refer to is “What are you doing here?”

So maybe you are not living in sin, maybe you are not trying to hide from God, maybe you have just made some decisions in your past that brought you this way and this is where it seems that you got stuck. Maybe you got comfortable where you are and accepted that this is where you should be.

This question indicates that

- God is interested in your life
- God is not finished with you, he has plans for you
- God wants to reveal Himself to you in a fantastic way

Where are you? What are you doing here? God is asking you these questions.

Take a look at your life, I’m not saying you’re living in sin, I’m not saying you’re hiding.

Maybe you have just done something great like Elijah and you might be sitting at a place where you have to reflect and gain new perspective and maybe you need to hear Gods’ voice on your next assignment.

If you just quiet down a bit, I suggest you ask the Father, “ Please speak to me, here I am waiting, I want to hear your voice.”
